

"If You Pay Attention, You Will Be Guided in the Right Direction" "Seek and You Will Find" (Matthew 7:7)

Sacrament of Holy Communion (*Joseph*)

PASTOR: The Lord be with you. And also with you. ALL: PASTOR: Lift up your hearts.
