NARRATOR: No matter how many times we hear the story of Christ's birth, we look forward to the retelling of the events of the moment. First, there was an angel with an announcement. Then, a census and shepherds...and a journey...a journey of hope for a frightened young virgin and a man named Joseph.

The Salvation of the world entered quietly that night through a small, cramped stable...in the midst of the small and seemingly insignificant town of Bethlehem.

But, here and now, we shout for joy and rejoice! Make music all ye lands! Arise, shine, for your Light has come! The One you seek has come! Joy to the earth...the Savior has come.

NARRATOR: In a very real sense, Mary and Joseph are here with us today, sitting there, and there, and over there. They are here because, in so many ways they are ...like us.
